


Arizona Divide The tipping point where water runs north or northwest into the Colorado River watershed or south or southwest into the Gila River watershed. The divide is for a short time only, as the Gila eventually flows into the Colorado near Yuma.

Trains through Flagstaff The BNSF Railway is among the top transporters of intermodal freight in North America. Amtrak Passenger Trains also run through the town.

San Francisco Peaks Three summits—Humphreys (12,635 feet, the highest point in Arizona), Agassiz, and Fremont peaks located 10 miles (16 km) north of Flagstaff.




They see a Grand Canyon so far and so wide, stretching on, East to West. They pause at the side.

Grand Canyon The Grand Canyon of the Colorado River is a mile-deep canyon (1.6 km). The National Park encompasses 277 river miles (446 km) of the Colorado River and adjacent uplands.

South Rim of Grand Canyon Averages 7,000 feet/2134 m above sea level. As you approach, you have little to no warning about the majestic landscape you are about to see. @South Rim of Grand Canyon











By the time it's all over, they're on the North Side of the mighty Grand Canyon. OH, what a ride!

North Rim The North Rim of Grand Canyon National Park, over 8,000 feet/2438 m. in elevation, lies just 10 miles (16 km) across the canyon from the South Rim (as the California condor flies) but is a 220 mile/354 km drive by car if you drive "around" through Lees Ferry.
