



She meets Coco and Coconut, King Penguins who say they are cousins of Izzy's from Antarctica way.


"I'll search for MY cousins!"

A quick hug for Allie, then Haboob lifts him afloat!

As she travels along, Allie looks to the sky. She sees a great condor, soaring up, up so high.

9 Haboob (huh • BOOB) A violent wind blowing in summer stirring up sand and creating a wall of sediment that precedes the storm cloud. For our story, Haboob is also a transporter! Haboob time travels with Pismo in Book Location 5.



Climbing up higher the wind whips the air. "Brrr" says Allie, "I'm glad I have such thick hair!"

Aubrey, a guanaco cousin, pronks with her baby to say, "I'm glad you've arrived in Bolivia! Come play!"

- Guanacos are wild animals and live on land high in the Andes mountains up to 13,000 ft. (3,962 m.) above sea level as well as on the lower plateaus, plains, and coastlines of Peru, Chile, and Argentina. –Nat Geo Kids
- Pronk, a leap in the air with an arched back and stiff legs, is a form of display, showing off, or when threatened.
- Praying Mantis, Aubrey's friend, belongs to the *Mantodea* order, which has 2,400 species... [and] can change color...(!) –AZ Animals



- Chimborazo volcano in Ecuador is the point on Earth closest to the sun when measured from the center of the Earth. –Gered Ryan, M.S.

Says DeeDee, "You've been traveling under Andean skies. Angel Falls is now where the true magic lies."


- DeeDee is a migrating hummingbird who, due to her ability to travel over 3,000–4,000 miles, appears in the Chase series books Costa Rica, Location 8; the Chiricahua Mountains, Arizona, Location 9; and here in Location 7.
- Angel Falls, the highest waterfall in the world, barely makes contact with the cliff over which it flows. About 20 times higher than Niagara Falls, it plunges 3,212 feet (979 meters) and is about 500 feet (150 meters) wide at its base. –Britannica @Venezuela-7g





The Condor flies down.

Andean Condors are vultures, large birds that do not hunt for food. Instead, they feed on the remains of dead animals, called carrion. They are important participants in the Circle of Life.


