


While gray whale Mama Bella, in her warm Baja home, welcomes Baby Diego,

5 Magdalena Bay, along the western coast of Baja California, Mexico, is a calving and breeding ground for many gray whales. The sun rises over the Bay and sets to the west over the Pacific Ocean. This storyteller saw her first gray whales there in 2023.



Mama Bella worries that Diego will stray far from her side and warns, "Keep close to the bay!" But then one night, when the moon shone bright, he just did it!

Diego swam away.

Mama Bella had told him, "Stay close by my side." But the sea was so tempting, he wanders out with the tide.



He dives with the dolphins. He frolics with fish. "Wait? What did Mama say?" He forgets Mama's wish.

Many miles later, he spies Tess and her baby. "I'll ask them to help me. Maybe those two can save me!"




Meanwhile, Mama Bella searching wide for *her* baby, calls to octopus, Charlie, "Have you seen Diego lately?"

Bungeness Lighthouse, Olympic Peninsula, Washington was built in 1857 and is located between Port Townsend and Port Angeles in the Dungeness National Wildlife Refuge. The lighthouse enjoys views of the Cascade and Olympic mountain ranges... and whales off the coast. -AFAR



Clever Flo uses the wind to sail over. "I have a sound box. Use this to call Mother."

Bigfoot, also commonly referred to as Sasquatch, is a large and hairy humanlike mythical creature alleged by some to inhabit forests in North America, particularly in the Pacific Northwest. –Wikipedia Ollie just KNEW Bigfoot needed to make an appearance in this adventure!

Kite Surfing, a water sport that involves standing up on a surfboard, strapped in a waist harness while being pulled along by a large kite up 25 meters in the air. Here Flo does it with ease to join to her migratory friends.



Flo attaches the sound box to Diego with glee. "Now call to your mother far away in the sea."

Diego calls, "Mama, hear me! I'm searching for you. I know you're there somewhere in this ocean so blue."



Diego thanks Flo, then they swim on their way toward cold Alaskan waters. "Oh, why did I stray?"


Tess swims close to Diego who continues to shout.




The sound box grows heavy. Diego bravely keeps calling. At last ~ Mama appears! "I've found you, my darling!"




What a joyful reunion, all chasing with glee, singing happily together the Song of the Sea.


